■ adults and children 12 years and older:
□ take 1 tablet every 4 to 6 hours while symptoms persist
■ if pain or fever does not respond to 1 tablet, 2 tablets may be used ■ do not take more than 6 tablets in 24 hours unless directed by a doctor
■ children under 12 years: ask a doctor

Uses ■ Temporarily relieves minor aches and pains due to:
□ headache □ toothache □ backache
□ menstrual cramps □ the common cold
□ muscular aches □ minor pain of arthritis
■ temporary signs of fever

Warnings

Allergy alert: Ibuprofen may cause a severe allergic reaction, especially in people allergic to aspirin. Symptoms may include:
■ shock ■ facial swelling ■ asthma (wheezing) ■ hives ■ rash
■ blisters ■ skin redness
■ headache
■ toothache
■ backache
■ menstrual cramps
■ muscular aches
■ temporary signs of fever

Stomach bleeding warning: This product contains an NSAID, which may cause severe stomach bleeding. The chance is higher if you ■ are age 60 or older ■ have had stomach ulcers or bleeding problems ■ take a blood thinning (anticoagulant) or steroid drug ■ take other drugs containing prescription or nonprescription NSAIDs (aspirin, ibuprofen, naproxen, or others)
■ have 3 or more alcoholic drinks every day while using this product ■ take more or for a longer time than directed

Do not use: ■ if you have ever had an allergic reaction to aspirin or any other pain reliever/fever reducer ■ right before or after heart surgery

Ask a doctor before use if: ■ stomach bleeding warning applies to you ■ you have problems or serious side effects from taking pain relievers or fever reducers ■ you have a history of stomach problems, such as heartburn ■ you have high blood pressure, heart disease, liver cirrhosis, kidney disease, or asthma ■ you are taking a diuretic (water pill) ■ you are taking pain relievers or fever reducers for longer than directed

Stop use and ask a doctor if: ■ you experience any of the following signs of stomach bleeding: □ feel faint
■ have bloody or black stools □ vomit blood
■ have stomach pain that does not get better
■ pain gets worse or lasts for more than 10 days
■ fever gets worse or lasts for more than 3 days
■ fever or swelling is present in the ear area
■ any new symptoms appear

If pregnant or breast-feeding: ask a health professional before use. It is especially important not to use ibuprofen during the last 3 months of pregnancy unless definitely directed to do so by a doctor because it may cause problems in the unborn child or complications during delivery.

Keep out of reach of children. In case of overdose, get medical help or contact Poison Control Center right away.

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Drug Facts (continued)

Ask a doctor or pharmacist before use if you are under a doctor's care for any serious condition

■ under a doctor's care for any serious condition

■ taking aspirin for heart attack or stroke, because ibuprofen may decrease this benefit of aspirin

■ taking any other drug

When using this product ■ take with food or milk if stomach upset occurs ■ the risk of heart attack or stroke may increase if you use more than directed or for longer than directed
