The chance is higher if you: • are age 60 or • the smallest effective dose should be used older • have had stomach ulcers or bleeding problems • take a blood • adults and children 12 years and over: • take 1 tablet every 4 to 6 hours thinning (anticoagulant) or steroid drug • take other drugs containing prescription or nonprescription NSAIDs (aspirin, ibuprofen, naproxen, or others) • have 3 or more alcoholic drinks every day while using this product take more or for a longer time than directed

Heart attack and stroke warning: NSAIDs, except aspirin, increase the risk of heart attack, heart failure, and stroke. These can be fatal. The risk is higher if you use more than directed or for longer than directed.
